Color Balance

Atlanta decorator SUZANNE KASLER teams punchy solid squares with a geometric neutral: "Using pattern in a more muted tone makes the scheme sophisticated and striking," she says. Repeat pairs of bright and neutral pillows to fit the length of the sofa.

Mixed Texture

Designer THOM FILICIA's surefire formula blends one part allover small geometric with one part bold graphic and one part soft, cozy knit. The variety offers up an "interesting face-lift that feels modern and inviting," he says. Arrange both square pillows on one end of the couch, and place the lumbar on the other.
